


Bloodless - Douglas Preston and Lee Child




The Curator's Daughter - Melanie Dobson

A prayer labyrinth becomes a storehouse for Hanna's secrets, but as she comes to love Lilly as her own daughter, she fears that what she's hiding--and what she begins to uncover--could put them both in mortal danger. Eighty years later, Ember Ellis is a Holocaust researcher intent on confronting hatred toward the Jewish people and other minorities. She reconnects with a former teacher



Hummingbird Lane - Carolyn Brown





I Am Pilgrim - Terry Hayes





Is It Any Wonder - Courtney Walsh




