

Room to Dream (Front Desk #3), Kelly Yang



Fantasy/Adventure Fiction


Egg Marks the Spot (Skunk and Badger #2), Amy Timberlake, with pictures by Jon Klassen


Danny's Doodles #2: The Squirting Donuts, David Adler

Board Books and Picture Books


Boo! Baa! La La La!, Sandra Boynton
