

Katie encounters the harsh reality of life in the oil sands, where trauma is an everyday occurrence yet is never discussed. Beaton's natural cartooning prowess is on full display as she draws colossal machinery and mammoth vehicles set against a sublime Albertan backdrop of wildlife, northern lights, and boreal forest. Her first full length graphic narrative, *Ducks: Two Years in the Oil Sands* is an untold story of Canada: a country that prides itself on its egalitarian ethos and natural beauty while simultaneously exploiting both the riches of its land and the humanity of its people.



101 Accessible Vacations: Travel Ideas for Wheelers and Slow Walkers - Candy B. Harrington






Solito - Javier Zamora


Ukulele For Beginners: How to Play the Ukulele in Easy-to-Follow Steps - Will Grove-White








Get it Together: Organize Your Records So Your Family Won't Have To – Melanie Cullen, with Shae Irving J. D.



After saving the files to your computer, you will complete, print, and assemble the sections to create your personal planner. Later, when you want to update a section, you can simply modify the file on your computer.
