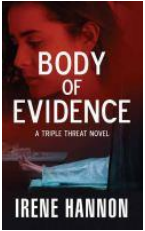


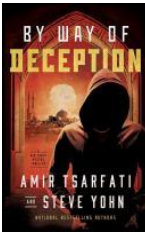

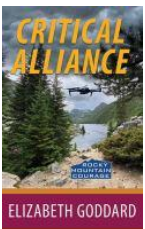

The Christmas Spirit - Debbie Macomber



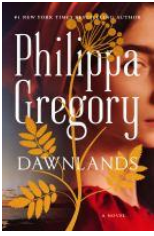

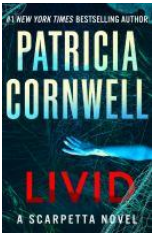

Livid - Patricia Cornwell



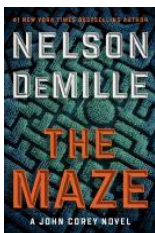

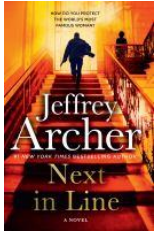
The Maze - Nelson DeMille

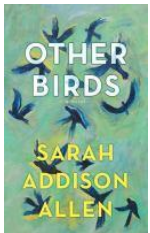

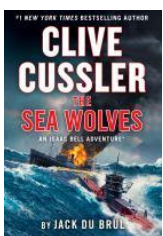

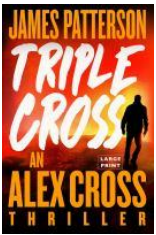
To Win a Prince - Toni Shiloh
